

Photography

Course Description:

Students will discover the techniques of modern digital photography, and how to create and present photographic art. They will connect visual art to societal, cultural and historical meaning through exploring their own artistic creations, as well as analyzing the impact of iconic photographers from the past. This course covers the essential photographic skills and techniques such as composition and exposure. Students will learn about modern digital equipment such as digital cameras, lenses, flash and other forms of lighting. Different artistic styles are explored, such as portraits, still life, landscape, action and street photography. The course combines analysis of photographs and appreciation of the history of photography with practical assignments where students capture their own images and produce their own creations. Part 1 of the course focuses on capturing the image, and Part 2 covers photo editing.
