

Spanish 1 Course Syllabus

Course Description:

Spanish 1 is an introductory course designed for students with little or no previous study of Spanish. This course teaches basic language patterns and vocabulary. Repetition and comprehensible input are important components of this course. The focus is on all four language skills; reading, writing, speaking and listening as well as the culture of the Spanish speaking world. Each unit will cover the vocabulary of a specific theme, (family, school, hobbies, food, etc.) and grammar concepts appropriate to level one. As students progress through each unit, they will build upon previously learned material and be given opportunities to strengthen their use of the language through all of the modalities.

Practice reading, writing, speaking and listening with the new material.

Practice the Spanish alphabet with an emphasis on pronunciation and writing of Spanish words and letters. Improve their listening comprehension skills by hearing a series of letters, words and phrases.

Learn numbers 31 and higher and practice using them in a variety of settings.

Learn to form questions using question words.

Practice answering basic questions both verbally and in written form.

Learn the present tense of the verb estar (to be) and basic rules for usage.

In Unit 3 students will:

Practice and learn the vocabulary for school, classroom nouns and expressions, school subjects and schedules. Learn and practice the vocabulary for days of the weeks, months and dates.

Learn and practice regular present tense -ar, -er and -ir verb endings and how to form sentences.

Conjugate regular present tense verbs and learn their corresponding personal pronoun pairings.

Learn the present tense of the verbs, tener (to have) and venir (to come) and practice using them in questions and answers.

In Unit 4 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary to identify people; including family and friends.

Use adjectives to describe self and others and learn the rules for adjective noun agreement.

Learn and practice the use of possessive adjectives. Revisit the present tense conjugations of the verbs ser and estar (which both mean, to be) and the specific rules governing their usage.

Learn and practice the expression, hay (there is, there are) with new as well as previously presented vocabulary.

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In Unit 5 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary for pastimes, hobbies, sports and places.

Learn and practice how to communicate likes and dislikes with the verb gustar (to like/be pleasing). Practice how to say, understand, and write where people go using the verb, ir (to go). Learn about stem changing present tense verbs; (e-ie, oue, and e-i), how to conjugate them and use them to communicate in a variety of settings.

In Unit 1 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary for travel, vacation, seasons and weather.

Learn and practice the irregular present tense "yo" (I) verbs

Use estar (to be) to express location, conditions and emotions

Learn to use estar with the present progressive ("ing") to express what they, or others are doing. Review the verbs ser and estar (to be) and their usage

To form short conversations, questions or dialogues using the new verbs in writing and speaking assignments.

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In Unit 2 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary for shopping, clothing, colors and other adjectives.

Learn and practice the verbs saber and conocer (to know).

Have an introduction to direct object pronouns and how to use them in sentences.

Learn the concept of indirect object pronouns and practice using them.

Review the verb gustar (to be pleasing) and learn verbs that are used in a similar fashion.

Increase cultural competency through videos and readings about shopping, clothing and markets in Spanish speaking countries.

In Unit 3 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary for daily routine, personal hygiene and time expressions. Learn about reflexive verbs and practice using them to express one's daily routine. Practice and learn how to use demonstrative adjectives and pronouns. Learn how to use indefinite and negative words.

Listen to others describe their daily routine using reflexive verbs and key unit vocabulary. Write about their own daily routine using reflexive verbs, vocabulary and time expressions.

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In Unit 4 students will:

Learn and practice the vocabulary for food, food descriptions and meals.

Learn about foods and meals in the Spanish speaking world and compare and contrast with the foods and meal customs in their own culture. Learn the past tense (preterite) of regular verbs and practice the conjugations.

Learn and practice how to conjugate the verbs ser (to be) and ir (to go) in the preterite. Learn and practice stem changing preterite verbs.

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
